Mill Creek Valley Board of Education Policy on Use of Tobacco Products in School Buildings

GAOC- Use of Tobacco Products in School Buildings:

The use of tobacco products in any form is prohibited in any school building, owned, leased or rented by the district, that is used for pupil attendance purposes.

JCDAA - Tobacco Use:

Smoking by students and/or the possession and use of any other tobacco product is prohibited in any attendance center, at school-sponsored events or on school property.

Administrators shall report students who are in violation of this policy to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
